PART 3: BACKGROUND

Background / Context	Grampians National Park is Victoria's fourth largest National Park. The park area, also known as Gariwerd is listed on Australia's National Heritage List for its Aboriginal cultural heritage, landscapes, diversity of flora, and fauna and protection of threatened species. The park is a popular destination for visitors, well known for its variety of recreational activities such as bushwalking, car touring, camping and rock climbing.
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Currently, free and aided rock climbing is largely unregulated in Grampians National Park. However, it has become apparent through observation and research (undertaken in other locations) that rock climbing is damaging both Aboriginal cultural heritage and the natural environment. Rock climbing causes damage to Aboriginal cultural heritage and the environment in a number of ways including through:

1. the manufacturing of holds by trundling or hold chipping the rock surface leading to direct damage to Aboriginal rock shelters and artwork and environmental damage through the removal of vegetation, changes in water flow and erosion,
2. the installation of fixed anchor points directly into rock faces leading to direct damage to Aboriginal rock shelters and artwork and environmental damage through the removal of vegetation, changes in water flow and erosion,
3. girdling of trees to create belay points leading to direct damage to vegetation,
4. removing and brushing vegetation during climbs leads to direct damage to vegetation, and
5. the use of chalk creates a visual disturbance and damages vegetation especially lichen and mosses that are integral to the health of vertical vegetation communities.

Benefits to PV

The exclusion of rock climbing from Sensitive Protection Zones and buffer zones will deliver significant Aboriginal cultural heritage benefits through the mitigation of risks to Registered Aboriginal Cultural Sites caused by rock climbing. In addition, the benefits to environmental processes will be significant over the longer term with a reduction in vegetation damage and removal and damage and the restoration of appropriate water flows and erosion processes likely to improve vegetation diversity in vertical vegetation communities to the same level as unclimbed rock faces.

The proposed Set Aside Determination also supports day to day park management and will allow Authorised Officers to issue Provisional Infringement Notices as required.

National Parks Act 1975

National Parks Regulations 2013

Setting aside areas in Gramplans National Park

The *National Parks Regulations 2013* have been made under Section 48 of the *National Parks Act 1975* (Vic.)

The *National Parks Regulations 2013* provide that Parks Victoria may for the purposes of regulation 10, make a determination to set aside an area as an area in which an activity or conduct is permitted, required, restricted or prohibited. Parks Victoria may include in the determination any conditions subject to which the activity or conduct must or must not be carried out.

Parks Victoria has delegated this power to the Executive Band in an instrument of delegation, the Parks Victoria Delegations Register, dated 18th December 2018.

Therefore I, Simon Talbot, Chief Operations Officer of Parks Victoria, determine under the *National Parks Regulations 2013* that the areas indicated in the table hereto appended are set aside for the activities specified or for the prohibition or restriction of access, at the times or periods, and in accordance with the conditions, as indicated.

Where the areas covered by this Set Aside Determination coincide with the areas covered by any other current Set Aside Determinations, this Determination replaces those Set Aside Determinations areas and is in force until such time as this Set Aside Determination is amended or revoked.

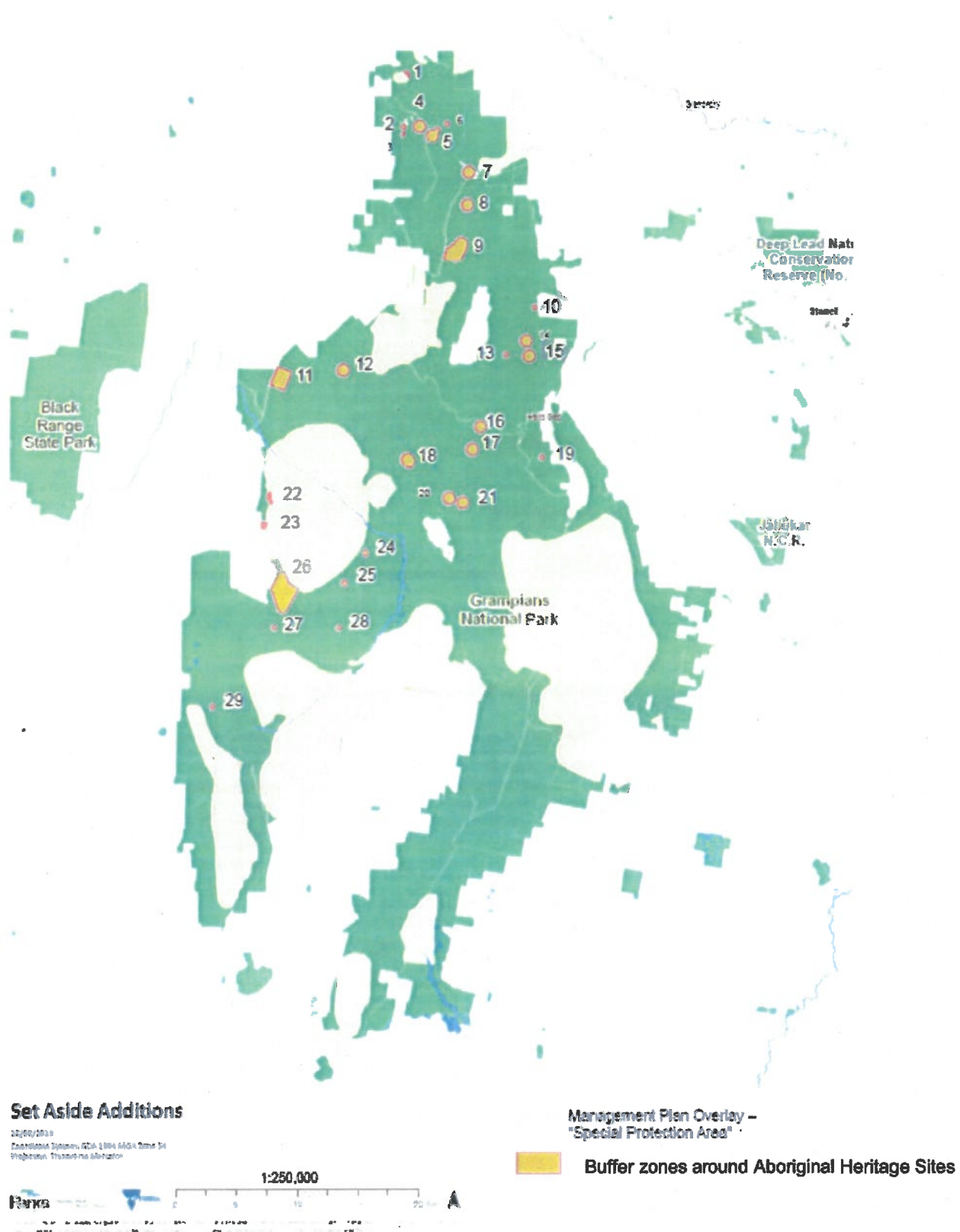

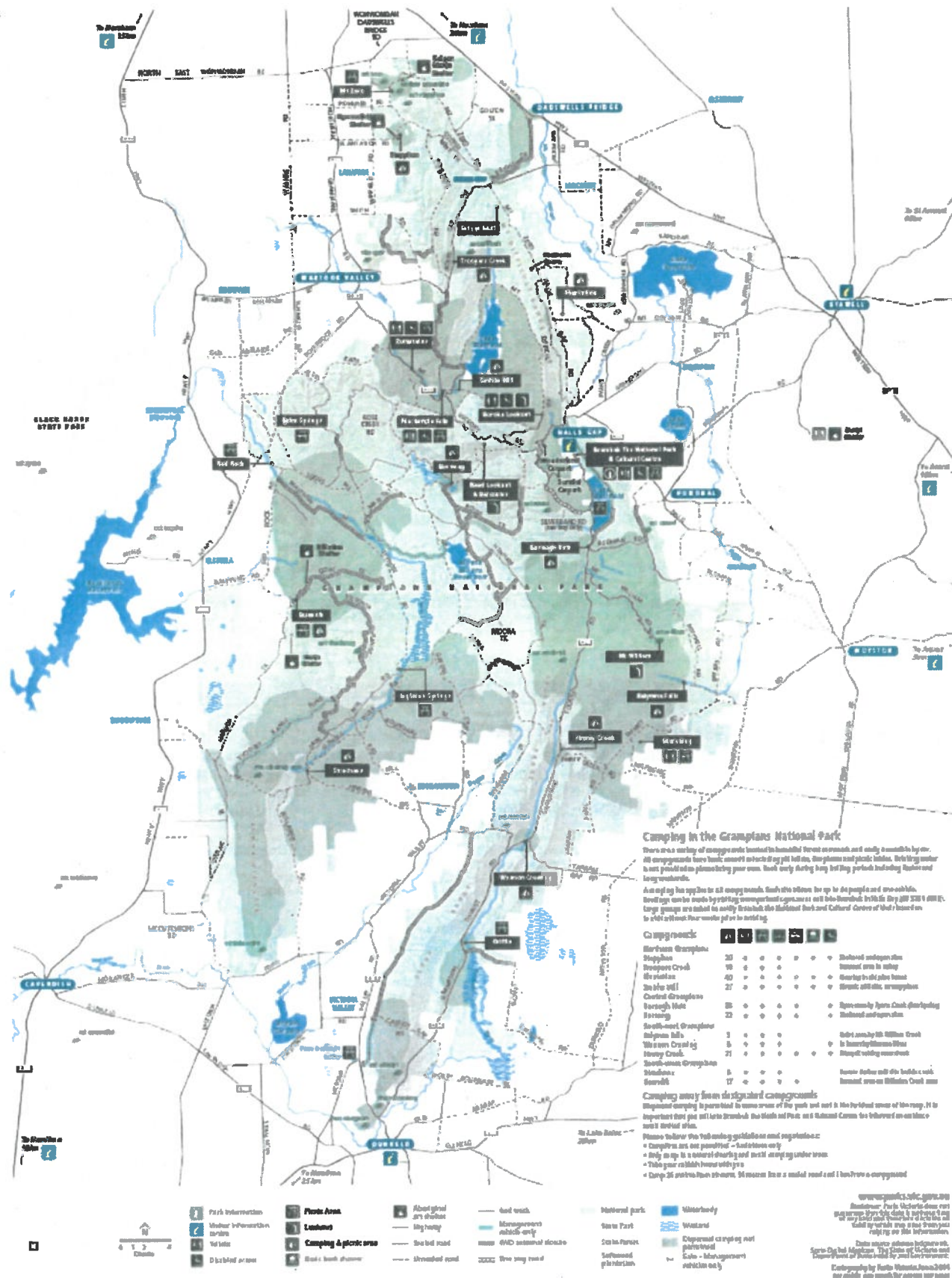

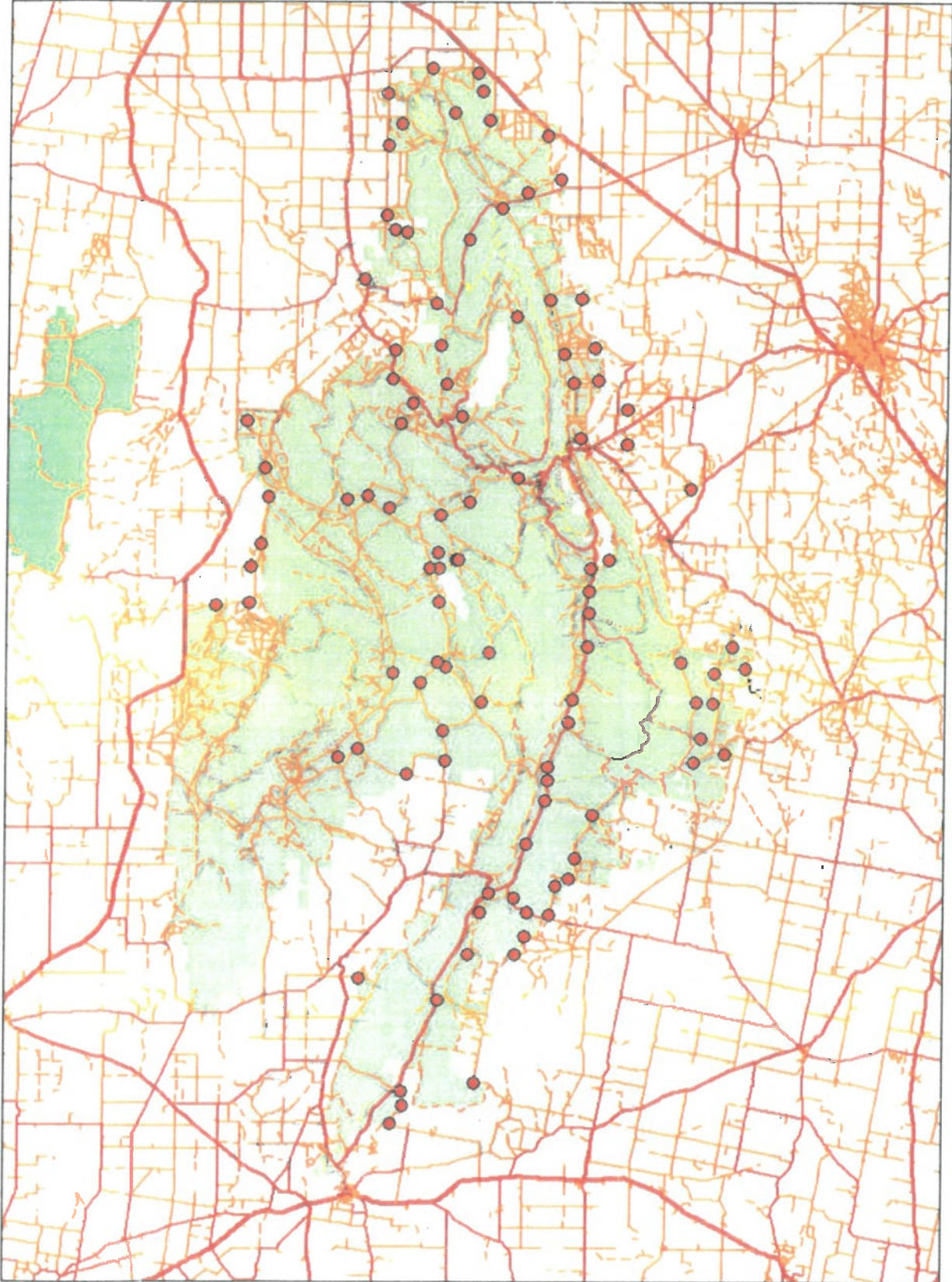
